3. The quality desired in agriculture and horticulture product exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market and such exhibits must be at the least equal in maturity as the state of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code in order to be considered for Premium awards.
4. Section 42513 -“Mature” means having reached that stage of ripeness that will ensure the completion of the ripening process to a degree that will insure palatability after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.
5. Section 42515 -“Overripe” means having an advanced state of maturity that causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.
6. VARIETY OF PRODUCT MUST BE ADEQUATELY AND CORRECTLY LABELED.
